Tom -

I just reviewed the mailing list issued by the City announcing the hearing this Wednesday, October 11 at 6:30 PM at City Hall regarding the DNS issued by the City for the proposed Weyerhaeuser Office buildings at the Port of Olympia. As you know, these are part of the Weyerhaeuser log export facility. The City has issued a DNS on this project and has NOT linked this project to the larger Weyerhaeuser log export facility of which it is a part.

I am writing to notify you that the mailing list does NOT include the Northwest Neighborhood Association. While this may have been an oversight, I find it remarkable in light of the detailed letter you submitted to the Olympia City Council on the proposed log export facility and the response to you prepared by the same office and individual responsible for the DNS and for the arrangement of the hearing this Wednesday.

You may wish to contact her to confirm the interest of the Northwest Neighborhood Association in all matters related to the Weyerhaeuser log export facility or, in the case the City position is that there is no such facility, related to any development at the Port that requires any permit or approval from the City of Olympia.
